### General guide for journal papers, books, dissertations/theses, conferences:

### Journal papers:

Google paper title. If there is an [NIH link](#), click on "cite"; also gives journal name abbreviation and doi).

### Notes:

1. 1st 6 authors, followed by "et al."
2. Paper titles in lower case (also after colon), unless proper nouns
3. Include the full page range for journal articles (e.g. 918-927, not 918-27)
4. Add a space after the year of publication (e.g. 2024; 5(4):918-927)
5. Add the doi
6. Don't include the Epub, PMID info, or the month.

### Example:

Le Prell CG, Clavier OH. Effects of noise on speech recognition: Challenges for communication by service members. *Hear Res.* 2017; 349:176-180. doi: 10.1016/j.heares.2016.10.004.

### If no doi:

Add "Available from: [url] (accessed dd mmm yyyy)" after page numbers".
